DISTANCE FROM WINDOW FOR LIGHT QUALITY

North-Facing Window

Bright: sorry :-(
 Medium: up to 1 foot
 Low: 1–3 feet

East-Facing Window

Bright: up to 1 foot
 Medium: 1–3 feet
 Low: 3–5 feet

South-Facing Window

Bright: up to 3 feet
 Medium: 3–10 feet
 Low: 10–18 feet

West-Facing Window

Bright: up to 2 feet
 Medium: 2–4 feet
 Low: 4–10 feet
