# HIGHLY TOXIC INDOOR PLANTS

These houseplants are very poisonous. When eaten, especially in large quantities, they can cause severe vomiting, diarrhea, stomach pains, skin irritations, and breathing difficulties. Eating parts of some of these plants can even be life threatening. If you love the aesthetic of toxic plants, consider alternative ways to display them in your home, such as propping them up with a trendy plant stand, hanging them from the ceiling, or placing them high on a shelf out of reach from a curious child or pet.
